## FAQs

- What type of visas do you sponsor? We accept J1 visas only
- What is the supplemental application?
  We will reach out to you after we have received your application to request the supplemental from you
- 3. Are residents required to do research? We do not have a requirement for research. However, it is an ACGME requirement that each resident undergo a quality improvement (QI) project prior to graduation. Aside from the QI projects, our residents have been involved in many research initiatives with attendings or created their own.
- 4. How do residents perform on board exams? Our pass rate is at the national average.
- 5. Where do your residents end up? Some of our residents have graduated and went to practice on their own in the community. Others have gone to fellowships including sleep medicine, child and adolescent, women's mental health, and forensics.
- 6. Are there moonlighting opportunities? Our residents can begin moonlighting as a PGY-2 with more opportunities available as they advance through residency. The opportunities include our behavioral health emergency department, consult-liaison service, and the detoxification unit.
- When are residents required to pass Step 3/Level 3?
  Residents must pass the 3<sup>rd</sup> part of their board examination by the end of PGY-1.
- 8. What days of the week do you typically do interviews? Mondays and Fridays.
- 9. Are there opportunities to teach?

Yes! We have medical students from Wake Forest School of Medicine-Charlotte Campus and visiting medical students rotate with us on many of our services from inpatient to partial hospitalization to assertive community treatment (ACT) team. There are also opportunities to teach some medical student didactics.

Our hospital system uses Epic.



Our residents have didactics every Tuesday starting at noon; this is protected time therefore residents are not expected to respond to pages or other clinical duties. Didactics topics vary between each resident year, however include psychotherapy, psychopharmacology, introductions to diagnoses (bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, etc.), neurology, grand rounds from attendings, resident case conferences, journal club, and more.

Our most popular electives include forensics, pediatric consult-liaison, sleep medicine, and psycho-oncology. However, some of our residents have created their own electives like sports psychiatry and eating disorder clinic.
