The **Atrium Health Teammate Emergency Care Fund** was established to provide our teammates with financial assistance when they have suffered a hardship caused by catastrophic events beyond their control, including emergency support during COVID-19.

Examples of catastrophic events include fire, natural disasters, accidents, victim of crime, death of immediate family member. Individuals who have suffered a financial hardship caused by a catastrophic event and who have used all other resources, may apply for assistance.
