







North Carolina Poison Control (NCPC) is the poison control center serving all of North Carolina. The center is staffed by nurses, pharmacists and toxicologists who are expertly trained in handling poisonings. You can reach NCPC by calling 1-800-222-1222. NCPC helps people of all ages. Often poison control is thought of as a service primarily helping parents with young children. However, about the same percentage of adults contact us for help as do parents of young children.

NCPC also assists healthcare providers by giving treatment recommendations for their poisoned patients. One-fourth of our calls come from healthcare facilities across the state.
