Taking Care of Our Community at the Women's Health Event



It was a full house of over 250 women on February 2, 2013

Women's Health Event:

The annual Women's Health Event was held Saturday, February 2nd at a local church. Community Health Assessment surveys indicated that most people have a general knowledge of how lifestyle choices impact health; however most report that for reasons related to cost, access, and convenience it is difficult to consistently eat a healthy diet, get enough physical activity, and seek medical care. A full day of events was scheduled focusing on women and creating healthy lifestyles highlighted by a keynote speech by Celia Riverbark. The effectiveness of the event was apparent when participants were asked to raise their hand if the information learned would help them make more positive changes going forward. An overwhelming 99% raised their hands. The event was attended by over 250 women.



Mammogram Screening Program:

According to the Community Needs Assessment, the majority of cancer deaths in Scotland County include breast cancer. One of the areas identified as a reason for lack of medical care was the cost. We continued to work with the Scotland Memorial Foundation and Scotland Imaging to provide mammograms for uninsured patients through the foundation and grant funds from Susan G. Komen and Pfizer Company. The imaging center performed 231 mammograms with these programs of which seven patients had to have additional views and/or ultrasound. Of those seven, one resulted in a diagnosis of DCIS breast cancer.

Taking Care of Our Community at the Men's Health Event



Men's Health Event:

The Community Needs Assessment identified areas needed for improvement for the men of Scotland County. Prostate Cancer was among the top five sites that the majority of cancer deaths occurred from. We continued to work with the Scotland Memorial Foundation and area physicians to screen men for prostate cancer. This year we had 88 men who completed the PSA screening and 34 of them needed additional follow up. The event was well attended by over 200 men and included other topics to help men improve their lifestyles such as healthy eating and education on diabetes.



Fifth Annual Cancer Symposium Attended by Area Medical Providers

Annual Cancer Symposium:

The fifth annual Cancer Symposium, hosted at Scotland Memorial and coordinated by Duke Oncology Network and Scotland Cancer Treatment Center, was held on November 8th. Area physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and allied health professionals attended for sessions about the Diagnosis and Treatment of Prostate Cancer. We chose Prostate cancer as our focus from the top five sites identified in our Community Needs Assessment. The Scotland Memorial Foundation continues to support the Scotland Cancer Treatment Center by raising funds to allow the center to assist our patients with various needs such as wigs, gas assistance, medication assistance, and patient's snacks to name just a few.
