Mammogram Assistance Program:

We continued to work with the Scotland Memorial Foundation and Scotland Imaging to provide mammograms for uninsured patients through the foundation. The imaging center performed 228 mammograms with this program of which 7 patients had to have additional views and/or ultrasound. Of those seven, one resulted in a diagnosis of breast cancer.

Prevention Programs:


November 19th "The Great American Smoke Out" was held in main lobby of the hospital by Hope Gibson, cancer center lung navigator, along with Community health navigator, Patrick Bines. Twenty people filled out a survey onsite about the effectiveness of the campaign. Fifteen people stated they will consider quitting after speaking with us, 17 indicate they found information useful. A drawing was done at the end of event for a Wal-Mart gift card.

November 19th - Hope Gibson, cancer center lung navigator, spoke on the radio along with Lynn Soles, assistant director of imaging center. She talked about the statistics for Scotland Co. as well as National statistics for lung cancers and related deaths. Lynn spoke about new Low Dose CT screenings.

Patient Navigation Program:

2015 Marked the beginning of our patient navigation program. Hope Gibson, RN, became Scotland Cancer Treatment Center's first patient navigator. We began our navigation program focusing on breast cancer patients, lung cancer patients and patients with colorectal cancer. The Community Needs Assessment showed the greatest need in our area was with the lung and colorectal patients due to the high number of smokers and people with unhealthy lifestyles in Scotland County. Our navigation area is now focusing on those two areas and Hope is working with area physicians through the cancer center to help navigate these patients through their cancer treatment.







Standard 1.8: COMMUNITY OUTREACH Women's Health Event:

The annual Women's Health Event was held Saturday, February 7th at a local church. A full day event focused on the health issues of women. Topics include physical fitness, chronic disease, financial concerns, health screenings, advance directives, and cancer concerns. Sylvia Baffour was our key note speaker. She spoke on "Learning, Laughing, and Loving More than Ever Before". The effectiveness of the program and her speech was apparent by the show of hands when she asked the audience if what they learned today would help them make choices to live a healthier lifestyle. All women in attendance raised their hands saying they had learned things to help them make better choices.

Men's Health Event:

The Men's Health Event was held on June 18th of this year which was attended by 68 men. We continued to work with the Scotland Memorial Foundation and area physicians to screen men for prostate cancer by having a day prior to this event for prostate exams and to check PSA levels on the registered men who would like to have this done.
