### Surgical Technology

Cabarrus College clinical programs embrace best practices in healthcare education and prepare students for professional licensure, certification, and practice. Educational requirements to sit for credentialing examinations and to practice vary from one state to the next.

Cabarrus College's Surgical Technology program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) and is designed to prepare students to sit for the national Certified Surgical Technologist (CST) examination with researched educational requirements for the following states and territories, and per federal requirements, has determined whether or not its program curricula meet educational requirements for licensure/certification.
