Yellow Zone: Caution	Yellow Zone Means:
<ul> <li>If you have any of the following signs and symptoms:</li> <li>Weight gain of 3 or more pounds in 2 days or 5 pounds in 1 week</li> <li>Increased cough</li> <li>Increased swelling</li> <li>Increased in shortness of breath with activity</li> <li>Increased number of pillows needed</li> <li>Have less than 3 days of prescribed medications available</li> <li>Are not sure what medications to take today</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Your symptoms indicate that you need an adjustment in your medications</li> <li>Call your Care at Home nurse and/or your physician</li> <li>Contact</li> <li>Phone Number</li> <li>(Please notify your Care at Home nurse if you contact or go see your MD)</li> </ul>
Red Zone: Medical Alert	Red Zone Means:
<ul> <li>If you have any of the following signs and symptoms:</li> <li>Unrelieved shortness of breath — shortness of breath at rest</li> <li>Unrelieved chest pain</li> <li>Wheezing or chest tightness at rest</li> <li>Need to sit up in a chair to sleep</li> <li>Weight gain or loss of more than 5 pounds in 2 days</li> <li>Confusion or change in ability to speak complete sentences</li> <li>If it is harder for you to walk your usual distance</li> <li>Have taken wrong dose or missed a dose of medication today</li> </ul>	This indicates that you need to be evaluated by a physician right away Primary MD Phone Number Call your physician right away or call 911 (Please notify your Care at Home nurse if you go to the emergency room or are hospitalized)
Call your physician immediately if you are going into the RED zone
