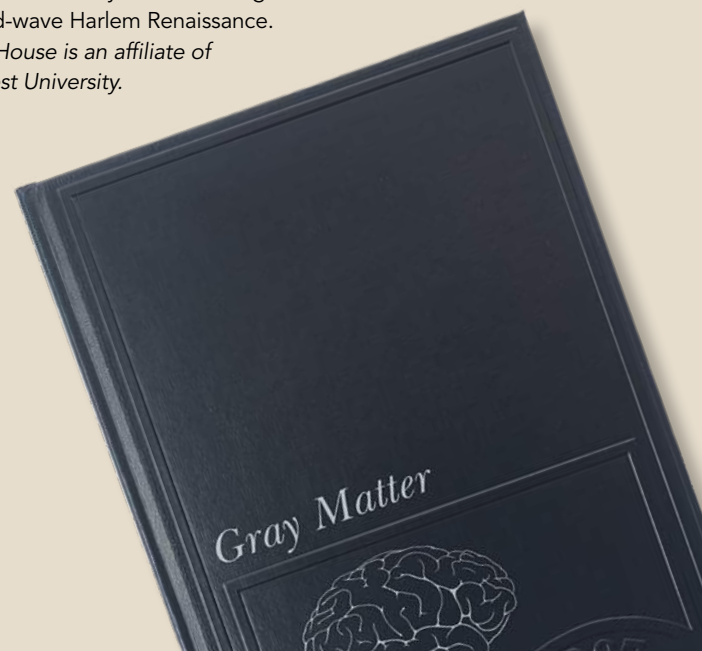
Reynolda House Museum of American Art Tour

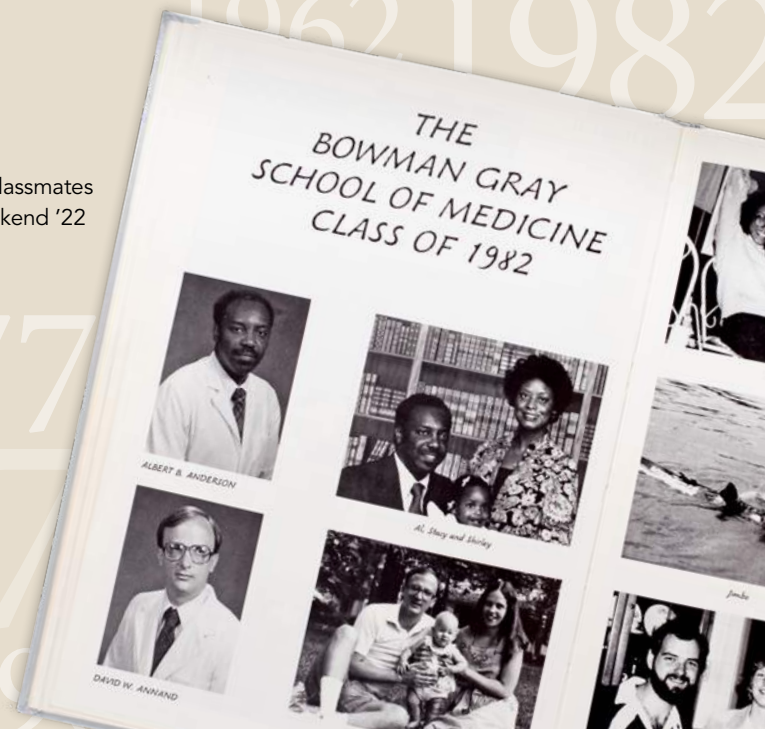

Commencement, even in the Consortium, climaxed a year in which the horizons of In Patient medicine were widened by introduction to the Out Patient Clinic with its intensive pursuit of psychodramatics. Another peek into the surgical specialties and psychiatry failed to bulge the ranks of superspecialists. OB offered little else but a reshuffling of the hours. Pediatric pedagogy, surgical sagacity, medical methodology were remembered with reverence as, unbelievably, Bowman Gray was already being thought of with a bit of nostalgia.
