We have a full weekend of activities planned, all of which are outlined in this brochure. Following the afternoon's



Reynolda House welcomes Wake Forest University School of Medicine alumni to explore the museum's historic landscape, permanent collection of American Art and featured exhibition, Andrew Wyeth at Kuerner Farm: The Eye of the Earth. One of the most popular and celebrated American artists

of the 20th century, Andrew Wyeth spent seven decades painting a particular farm in his hometown of Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania. This exhibition will be the first comprehensive examination of this defining subject in his work in 50 years and tells the story of the connection between artist and place. Wyeth painted nearly 1,000 depictions of Kuerner Farm, including some of his most iconic masterworks in tempera and watercolor. In addition to a wide variety of loans from public and private collections, many of the artworks on view are drawn from Andrew and Betsy Wyeth's private collection, including some that have never been exhibited before.


