


Navigating Resources

CHWs' Role in Navigating Genetic Resources



Connect patients to local and national resources

Help patients
navigate
referrals to
genetic
specialists

Educate about insurance coverage for genetic services

Share culturally appropriate materials about genetics

Share trusted resources like CDC, NIH, and advocacy groups



Steps for CHWs to Navigate Genetic Resources

Assess Needs

- Understand patient goals (e.g., testing, counseling, family education).
- Identify barriers such as financial constraints or language preferences.

Identify Resources

- Match patients with services tailored to their genetic risk and needs.
- Verify the availability of culturally competent care providers.

Facilitate Referrals

- Help patients schedule appointments with genetic counselors or specialists.
- Ensure they have necessary documentation for referrals.

Provide Follow-Up

- Assist with understanding genetic test results.
- Encourage ongoing communication with healthcare providers.




