

Recommended Computer Specifications

Wake Forest School of Medicine provides students with recommendations of laptop specifications that help ensure successful performance and operation within the curriculum. Students are responsible for maintaining a laptop with a supported operating system that is no more than 4 years old at the start of the program.

NOTE: Intel ARM and ATOM processors, Chromebooks, and Android tablets and Microsoft Surface laptops are not compatible with curriculum software. Intel processor must be a minimum of <u>generation 8</u> or higher.
