Graduate Medical Education & Patient Support Services

The Northwest AHEC-supported Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center's primary care (Family & Community Medicine, Internal Medicine, and Pediatrics) and Psychiatry residency programs graduated 58 physicians in 2018. Thirty-six (62%) of these new physicians have chosen to stay in North Carolina to begin their initial medical practice or to further their education through various fellowships.

The following chart outlines the outcomes of the recruitment, graduation and retention of these programs in addition to their service to the uninsured and underinsured in the community.
