During 2017, **593 distinct students** enrolled at Carolinas College of Health Sciences. **446 of these students were enrolled for the fall term**. 1,759 individuals applied for admission to the college that year — with only 33% being accepted. Of those selected, 331 students or approximately 58%, actually enrolled.




