STUDENT ENROLLMENT

During all of 2019, **640 distinct students** enrolled at Carolinas College of Health Sciences. **476 of the 640 students were enrolled for the fall term**. 1360 individuals applied for admission to the college that year — with 40% being accepted. Of those selected, 355 students or approximately 65%, actually enrolled.





For Current Degree and Certificate Programs, Percentage of Those Placed Who Gained Employment in Field Within Atrium Health




