During all of 2020, **667 distinct students** enrolled at Carolinas College of Health Sciences. **514 of the 667 students were enrolled for the fall term**.

1364 individuals applied for admission to the college in 2020 — with 41% being accepted. Of those selected, **365 students** or approximately 65%, actually enrolled.






