STUDENT ENROLLMENT &

During all of 2021, **658 distinct students** enrolled at Carolinas College of Health Sciences. **473 of the 658 students were enrolled for the fall term**.

1805 individuals applied for admission to the college in 2021 — with 29.3% being accepted. Of those accepted, **390 students** or approximately 54%, actually enrolled.



For Current Degree and Certificate Programs, Percentage of Those Placed Who Gained Employment in Field Within Atrium Health




