

INSTRUCTIONAL FACILITIES

Carolinas College is located within The Pearl at 915 Pearl Park Way, Charlotte, NC 28204. The Pearl houses classrooms, laboratories, offices, and common space for students and teammates; and operation hours are Monday – Friday, 8:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M.

Most of the College's programs have a dedicated or shared lab available to students and faculty during and outside class time, allowing for learning experiences and the practice of skills.

Most academic programs at the College have access to dedicated or shared laboratories, which are available to students and faculty both during and outside of scheduled class times.

Carolinas College operates as a bring your own device campus. Additional computers for student use are at the South Piedmont Area Health Education Center (AHEC) Library.

The college partners with the South Piedmont AHEC Library located on the campus of Atrium Health - Carolinas Medical Center (CMC) to provide comprehensive information and library services to students and faculty members. The library is an 11,500-square foot facility providing print and digital media and reference materials as well as multiple computer stations, audio-video viewing rooms and conference rooms. Wi-Fi enabled meeting and quiet study spaces are available 24-hours a day, seven days a week via ID badge access. The library's collection is organized according to the National Library of Medicine's classification standards. In addition to the traditional library services, students and faculty members have full access to the AHEC Digital Library (ADL) providing more than 7,000 full-text journals, e-books and robust databases. The ADL is available from any computer with internet access, either on or off campus.

Carolinas College provides its students and faculty access to Carolinas Simulation Center, a globally recognized, multidisciplinary education center. The center is accredited by both the American College of Surgeons as a Comprehensive Education Institute and the Society for Simulation in Healthcare in the areas of assessment, research, teaching/education and systems integration. One of only a few centers in the world with dual accreditation distinguishes the center as a regional leader in providing simulation-based healthcare education. Carolinas Simulation Center is available to college faculty members for teaching specific skills and clinical situations in a simulated environment and to students for the practice of skills, critical thinking, communication and teamwork.
