POLICY

Carolinas College of Health Sciences participates in Title IV programs and is therefore required by the Student Right-to-Know Act and corresponding regulations to provide basic consumer information to students.

PROCEDURE

- A. Consumer Information. The college will disclose the success rate of their full-time, undergraduate students who graduate or complete a program of study and will disclose the rate at which full-time, undergraduate students transfer out of the institution to other institutions.
 - 1. Graduation rates will be published on an annual basis for all programs.
 - 2. Information about Carolinas College of Health Sciences transfer rates will be published on an annual basis for all programs.
 - 3. Students excluded from these calculations will include students who left the college:
 - a. to serve in the Armed Forces
 - b. to serve on official church missions
 - c. to serve with the foreign aid service of the Federal Government or
 - d. are totally and permanently disabled or have died.
- B. In compliance with the Higher Education Amendments of 1992, the annual campus security report will be distributed to all students and employees annually by September 1, through appropriate publications. The report will also be made reasonably available to all prospective students and employees.
 - 1. In partnership with Atrium Health, Carolina College will complete an annual campus security report. The dean of student affairs and enrollment management will distribute this report to all teammates and students, and the financial aid office will ensure that the report is distributed to all prospective students as required by regulation.
- C. The Student Right to Know policy and procedure will be reviewed bi-annually.
