

TRANSFER CREDIT

Courses for transfer are reviewed, and credit is awarded on a course-by-course basis. An official transcript reflecting courses or test scores to be transferred is required. Additional information such as catalog course description or course syllabus may be requested.

1. Courses **must** be college level and comparable in content and credit. (To convert a quarter hour to semester credits, multiply the credits earned by 0.667).
2. Courses must have been taken at a regionally accredited degree-granting institution.
3. **Science** courses must have been taken within five years of the desired admission date.
4. Grade earned must be a "C" or higher.


Transfer credit does not earn a grade and is not computed with the CCHS grade point average. Comparable courses taken at other post-secondary institutions, Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations, International Baccalaureate (IB) Examinations, Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) or American College Testing (ACT) scores, College Level Examination Program (CLEP) examinations, and challenge exams may be considered for credit.

Officially documented credit must be obtained by the end of the registration drop/add period of the first semester of enrollment. Total credit awarded for any combination of the above may not exceed 75% of the program's total semester credit requirements.

COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM (CLEP)

Credit for some CCHS courses may be earned through CLEP testing. CLEP tests allow you to demonstrate that you have already mastered the course content. Many 4-year colleges and some community colleges offer CLEP testing. (Consult www.collegeboard.com/clep.) Official CLEP scores must be sent to CCHS.

SAT/ACT

An SAT EBRW score of 480 or ACT score of 22 or higher will be eligible for credit for ENG 101. An SAT math score of 530 or ACT score of 22 or higher will be eligible for credit for MAT 143. Exams must have been taken within the past 5 years.

CHALLENGE EXAM POLICY

A request including how the course was completed, and a \$50 fee must be submitted prior to scheduling the exam. A "C" or higher must be obtained to receive the course credit.
